It is a great tool for you to use as you begin to open your meetings to be physical rather than virtual. There is no doubt that, as you conducted your meetings virtually, the "normal" protocol that you would have followed was somewhat modified. As A16 Lions, we pride ourselves in doing things well so it would be extremely helpful for you to look at the guide and its recommendations. The revised guide is currently on the District A16 Webpage.

Also contained in the guidebook are some points concerning safe practice as we continue to deal with Covid-19. The Health Unit Protocols are clear, and it is imperative that we continue to follow them. How can we help others if we don't take care of ourselves? There are many informative articles available but my favourite one is the "Book of Common Sense".

- Download the digital enhanced vaccination certificate (with QR code) on to your device. You can download it from this website: <u>https://covid-19.ontario.ca</u> It's a handy way to show proof of vaccination.
- Download the Verify Ontario App. It allows you to scan someone's QR code for easy proof of vaccination. A simple search will lead you to the best way to do this depending on what device you are using.




A-16 Global Membership Team (GMT) coordinator **Lion John Relph**



The Newsletter Editor was happy to speak to our A-16 Global Membership Team coordinator Lion John Relph on his new role.

Editor: You are a retired police officer. How do you find your previous experience in policing helped you in serving as a Lion?

GMT Lion John: As a police officer I spent some 30 years serving the public. I served in a supervisory role which has helped me serve my club as its president and other board positions. Having spoken to members of the public about policing and its benefits also assists me in speaking to the public about the benefits of becoming a Lion. When serving as a police officer you engage the community to work together to help those in need. As a Lion WE SERVE. As a Police Officer WE Serve and Protect.



Editor: You took up the role as our District GMT coordinator in July. Can you share your perspective on club membership in our District?

GMT Lion John: We currently have 55 clubs in our District with a YTD membership of 1106 members which relates to an average 20 members per club. A lot of the clubs are in large geographical areas with diverse populations. The membership is respectable however we need to do better. we need to tap into this diversity and find ways to retain our current members. The current pandemic has put a strain on the way in which we do business and has certainly deterred people from becoming members because not all the clubs are engaging in service activities which are crucial in the attracting of new members.

Editor: How do you see your role in supporting clubs in membership growth?

GMT Lion John: As GMT I am part of the Governors Global Action Team. I see my role as one that assists clubs in our district, bring in new members and rejuvenate current members of their club and assist them in finding the resources they need to make it happen. I also look at ways in which clubs in large geographic areas can help establish new clubs.

Editor: Do you have specific goals that you want to achieve as our GMT coordinator? And what will be your focus in working with Clubs in A-16?

GMT Lion John: The District Governor has a goal of increasing membership in A16 by 3% or 40 members in 2021-2022 Lions year and charter 2 new clubs. My goal is to work with the team and the clubs in A16 especially where new clubs are needed to achieve those goals. Ensure that continual training is done for the clubs in the area of membership development.

Editor: Is there anything else you would like us to know about yourself?

GMT Lion John: I am a member of the Lions Club of Stouffville. I have been a Lion since 2009. I have served in various club officer positions including Membership Chair and as our club's President for 3 terms. Most recently I was the Zone Chair in Region 18E for the 2020 - 2021 Lions year. I am also very active as a community volunteer in my community.

Thank you very much Lion John for talking to us.

The Greenbank Lions have found a unique way to raise funds and to help high school students during COVID-19. As part of their scrap metal recycling program they have purchased an electronic wire stripping machine to easily cut the plastic insulation around copper wire. They then give bags of the wire to local high school students who quickly peel off the insulation and roll the wire into a ball. Students keep track of their time and the Lions give them credit for their community volunteer service hours needed for graduation. At about \$5 a pound for scrap

copper the project generates lots of funds for community projects.

"AngelEye is a one-way communication tool that gives both picture and video opportunity for families to view their baby and for nurses to push that communication. We looked at a platform




Fortunately we are able to meet regularly, and we are working
