These guidelines will make it easier for us to make sure your submission is properly processed. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in your submission being missed or directed incorrectly.

<u>**Do not**</u> submit multiple submissions within the same email. Please separate them, this will help us keep track of each submission.

<u>Do</u>, include all content in the email. If content is too much for a single email then please make sure to reference that there are multiple emails related to your submission (Example: You can add "Email 1 of 3" in the subject line)

The Email's subject should include:

"Club Name" <u>or</u> "Committee name" **and** "DG Newsletter" **and/or** "Lions Magazine" submission. **Club submission**

<u>Sample Subject</u>: "Ajax Lions Club – DG Newsletter and Lions Magazine Submission" **Committee submission**

<u>Sample Subject</u>: "Webmaster/IT – DG Newsletter Submission"

Omemee Lions: Legacy Project

The Omemee and District Lions unwittingly started something big when they launched their Legacy project to mark the 100th anniversary of Lions International and the 60th year of the local club.

The Lion-led Discover Omemee Project expanded and evolved to become a truly community effort that now includes the Omemee Legion, the Cross-Canada Trail, the City of Kawartha Lakes, and RTO8, the area's tourism promoter.

The community's shortage of signage and maps meant many of the points of interest and businesses were either unknown or hidden away.

The project includes wayfinding map and signs, a community-oriented mural on the Legion's west wall, a historical walking tour of the village on CoKL's web site, and pocket maps showing local businesses and attractions, to be distributed to visitors.

The goal is to publicize businesses and points of interest in the village to help them attract visitors, customers and entrepreneurs.

Omemee Lions: 3rd Annual Chuckwagon Dinner

It was a crisp October Saturday as village youngsters showed off their artistry at the Omemee and District Lions Club's 3rd annual Chuckwagon Dinner in historic Coronation Hall.
