Happy New Year!







This year, 470 citizens including 300 children came to see Santa and enjoy the Christmas spirit our club provides. Children had their pictures taken with Santa, received a loot bag, had their faces painted, decorated cookies, and worked on crafts. Parents received food vouchers, family dental kits, and a small gift of their choice. For lunch, there were hot dogs (345), hamburgers (300), pasta (20 lbs.), French Fries (150 lbs.), Nanaimo bars (9 large boxes) and lots of good cheer.

As one parent said, "I can't believe that so many people care about us and the whole thing is Free. Thanks so much".
