Stouffville Lions Club

Blood Donor Clinic provided during COVID-19 Pandemic

The August 1st Blood Donor Clinic was led by Lion Roy O'Boyle of the Lions Club of Stouffville, with changes to accommodate the COVID-19 environment.

The clinic took clients from 9:00am to 2:00pm. All clients were Booked in advance (walk-ins were not accepted). Both Lions and volunteers assisted at the clinic.

The budget was 61 units, 54 were collected.

Here's a few notes on how the clinic was handled.

Four beds were set up, spaced apart as you would expect. The PPE being worn were masks (a couple of face shields were in evidence).

Donors lined up at the door and were interviewed in detail at the door on their COVID-19 status. After that they started progressing through the donation process (wearing masks and distancing at all times).

As all donations were booked in advance, the lineup was never longer than 2 people, and observing distancing was straightforward.

After donation, they were taken to the recovery area where they sat on a chair for the required 5 minute recovery and observation time. Although they were allowed to select cookies, munchies and the like, they were not allowed to eat them inside (to munch, they had to remove their mask). They were requested to not 'root' through the various items, because of the touch factor. We did not supply coffee.

Three volunteers are required at each shift - one at the entry door to direct people, one at the recovery area, and a standby to take over if required.

The program helps out 1500 people a month and provides 400,000 lbs of food annually.

On April 23rd, 2020 - May 14, 2020 the VMSLC members decided to show their appreciation for the Frontline staff of the Participation House. The Participation House provides supportive services to those with developmental and physical disabilities. The Club members provided lunch every Thursday from the \$1000 raised, during this period as frontline staff provided critical hard work and service during this period of time. The club served a total 220 people with their combined efforts. On the final day of activity the Club gathered to thank the staff for their service and hard work.

The VMSLC once again raised money during the months of June and July to provide lunch for the frontline staff at Markhaven Home for Seniors. The staff greatly appreciated the food and the time they were able to spend with their colleagues.

The money donated will go to the CMHA food security program created for people with mental needs. The money will go towards grocery cards worth \$25 each spread out in Markham Location.
